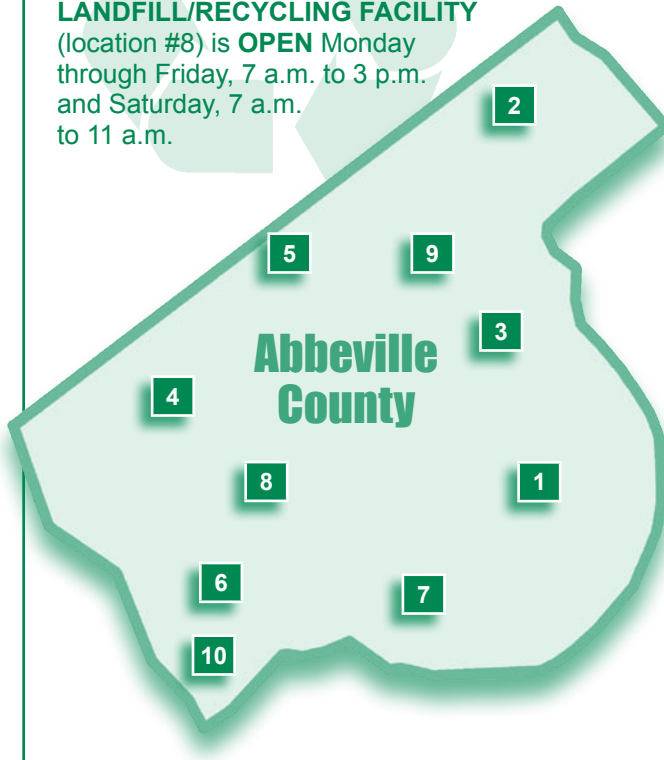


Abbeville County Recycling Locations

HOURS OF OPERATION: Convenience centers #1 through #7 are open Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.; Sunday, 2 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

LANDFILL/RECYCLING FACILITY (location #8) is **OPEN** Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Saturday, 7 a.m. to 11 a.m.

Why recycle?

TO SAVE NATURAL RESOURCES

- Recycled plastic beverage bottles can be made into carpet and T-shirts.
- When paper is made from recycled fibers, 58 percent less water is used – compared to making paper from raw materials.

TO SAVE ENERGY

- One aluminum can saves enough energy to power a television set for one hour.
- Two gallons of used motor oil has enough energy to power the average home for 24 hours.

TO SAVE LANDFILL SPACE

- It costs millions of dollars to construct new landfills. The less that goes into a landfill, the longer it will last.

Reduce. Reuse. Recycle.

- **REDUCE** the amount of waste you make.
- **REUSE** as many products and packages as possible.
- **RECYCLE** every possible material.

To complete the recycling process, **BUY RECYCLED** products and those packaged in recycle material.

ALUMINUM	Aluminum beverage and food cans, foil, pie pans, scrap aluminum	Rinse beverage containers, cans and pans.	Convenience Centers, Trailer Sites and County Landfill
APPLIANCES/SCRAP METAL	All appliances with metal parts (stoves, washers, dryers, refrigerators, grills, bicycles, etc.)		Convenience Centers and County Landfill
BATTERIES, LEAD-ACID	Used automotive batteries		Convenience Centers and County Landfill
CARDBOARD	Corrugated cardboard (no wax finish), cereal boxes, drink cartons	Empty and flatten. NO Styrofoam.	Convenience Centers, Trailer Sites and County Landfill
ELECTRONICS	Computers, monitors, printers, cordless and cell phones, microwave ovens, vacuum cleaners, televisions		Convenience Centers and County Landfill
FARMER OIL	Motor oil from farm equipment	Limit 55 gallons per visit.	George Alewine Rd. Convenience Center ONLY
OIL/GASOLINE MIXTURES			County Landfill ONLY
PAPER, NEWSPAPERS AND INSERTS	Mail, letterhead, notebook paper, sticky notes, envelopes, copy paper, computer paper, newspaper and wrapping paper etc.	Keep dry. DO NOT tie or bag. Staples are OK. <i>"If you can tear it, we can take it."</i>	Convenience Centers, Trailer Sites and County Landfill
PLASTIC	Plastic bottles and jugs (#1 and #2 ONLY)	Discard caps, rinse and flatten. Labels DO NOT need to be removed.	Convenience Centers, Trailer Sites and County Landfill
STEEL CANS	Food cans, pots, pans, etc.	Rinse.	Convenience Centers, Trailer Sites and County Landfill
TELEPHONE BOOKS AND MAGAZINES		Keep dry. DO NOT tie or bag.	Convenience Centers, Trailer Sites and County Landfill
TIRES	Used tires from cars and trucks		Convenience Centers and County Landfill
USED MOTOR OIL, BOTTLES AND FILTERS	Used motor oil and oil filters (Oil must be free of gasoline and antifreeze.)	Place bottles on drain racks at the convenience center.	Convenience Centers, Trailer Sites and County Landfill
